Guidelines for TRADITIONAL SINGLE SITE Poll Monitor Shift/s:

- In light of the ongoing threat of COVID-19, volunteers should notify us and NOT monitor if they are sick (regardless if it is COVID-19 or not).
 Volunteers are encouraged to engage in social distancing and wear a mask.
- Traditional volunteer poll monitors have one polling place to observe during your shift. You may be contacted to change locations.
- All volunteers must monitor outside of the 75 ft electioneering line to avoid any perception of electioneering.

At the beginning of your shift/s:

- > Familiarize yourself with the 75 foot electioneering line
- ➤ Place one Election Protection yard sign (if not present) at your assigned polling place.
- > Submit a Polling Place Checklist online using JotForm (if not online use paper form and text a picture of it or otherwise send it later)

During your shift/s:

- ➤ Submit an online Tally report each time you resolve voter questions using the Voter FAQ *without* calling 866 OUR VOTE or the Command Center.
- If you see or think you might be seeing signs of voter intimidation or have another issue affecting many voters fill out an Incident Report and call the command center.
- ➤ If you are not online, **call 866-OUR-VOTE** to report incidents and fill out the paper report form for checklists and tallies to send later.

At the end of your shift/s:

➤ If you have a late Monitor shift (4:30PM-8:30PM), retrieve the Election Protection yard sign (if present) and coordinate to return it.
