



Redistricting Rules: Colorado Rules

Who draws the lines?

- Congressional lines are drawn by an independent commission,
- ► State legislative lines are drawn by an independent commission





Redistricting Rules: Colorado Rules

What are the mapping rules?

- Federal equal population requirements and abide by the Voting Rights Act and constitutional rules on race.
- Must not be drawn with the purpose to dilute the electoral influence of a racial or language minority group (Colo. Const. Art. V, §§ 44.3(4)(b))
- For congressional districts: make a good-faith effort to achieve "precise mathematical population equality"
- For state legislative districts: make a good-faith effort to achieve "mathematical population equality" with no more than 5% deviation between most populous and lest populous district (Colo. Const. Art. V, §§ 48.1(4)(b))
- Districts must be:
 - Contiguous
 - preserve communities of interest and whole political subdivisions
 - Compact as is reasonably possible
 - ▶ To the extent possible, maximize the number of politically competitive districts
 - Not drawn to protect an incumbent or candidate
 - (Colo. Const. Art. V §§ 44(3)(b), 44.3, 46(3)(b), 48.1)
