

## **Redistricting Rules:** Georgia



## **At least 5 months:**

Public hearings to take communities of interest testimony

**Approx. 4 months:** 

Process census data, display draft maps, hold hearings, complete maps Court & County Prep





## Who draws the lines?

- Congressional lines are drawn by the state legislature as a statute and is subject to a gubernatorial veto
- State legislative lines are drawn by the state legislature as a statute and is subject to a gubernatorial veto
- Where local redistricting is required, and boundaries are moved more than necessary to comply with equal population requirements, the state legislature must approve the change.





## What are the mapping rules?

- Federal equal population requirements and adherence to the Voting Rights Act and constitutional rules on race
- Contiguity: all state legislative districts must be contiguous (Ga. Const. Art. III, § II, ¶ 2)
