


Redistricting Rules: Idaho



At least 5 months:

Public hearings to take communities of interest testimony

Approx. 3 months:

Process census data, display draft maps, hold hearings, complete maps Court & County

Redistricting Rules: Idaho Rules

Who draws the lines?

Congressional and State Legislative district lines are **drawn by an independent commission** (each of the majority and minority leaders from each chamber selects one commissioner, then the chairs of the two largest political parties each select one commissioner)





Redistricting Rules: Idaho Rules

What are the mapping rules?

- Federal equal population requirements and adherence to the Voting Rights Act and constitutional rules on race
- ► State legislative districts must be contiguous, and counties preserved intact where possible (Idaho Const. Art. III § 5)
- Congressional and State legislative districts preserve:
 - Counties to the extent possible
 - Traditional neighborhoods
 - Communities of interest
 - ► If possible, voting precinct boundaries
- Districts cannot be oddly shaped
- Population data is the only data that may be used, and county lines may not be divided to protect a political party or incumbent
- (Idaho Code § 72-1506)
