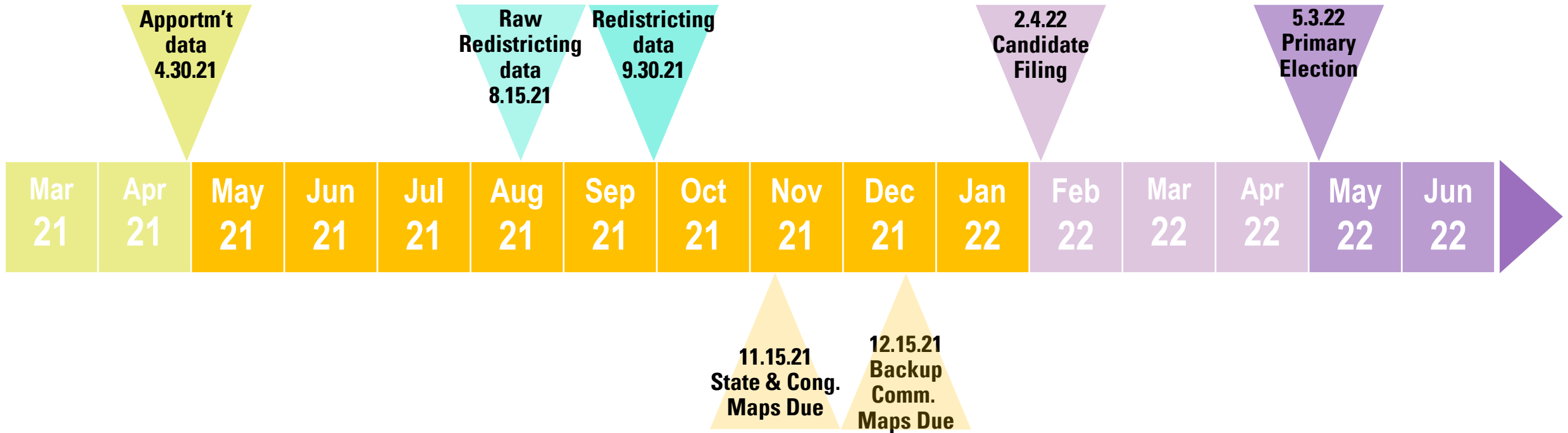
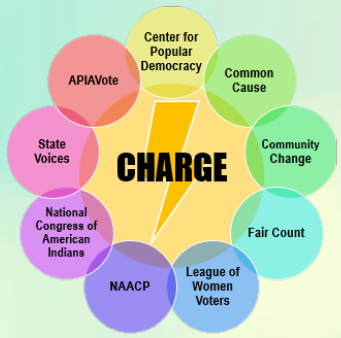

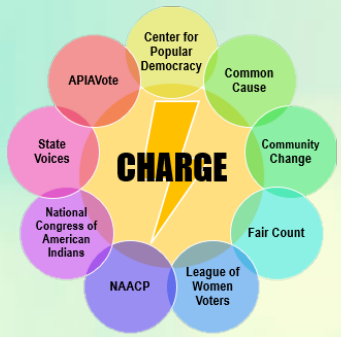




# Redistricting Rules: Indiana Rules

## Who draws the lines?

- ▶ Congressional lines are **drawn by the state legislature** as a statute and is subject to a gubernatorial veto. If a plan is not approved, a five-member backup commission – the majority leader from each house, the chair of the redistricting committee from each house, and a state legislator nominated by the governor – will draw districts.
- ▶ State legislative lines are **drawn by the state legislature** as a statute and is subject to gubernatorial veto.



# Redistricting Rules: Indiana Rules

## What are the mapping rules?

- ▶ Federal **equal population** requirements adherence to the **Voting Rights Act** and constitutional rules of the race
- ▶ State legislative districts must be contiguous. Ind. Const. art. IV, § 5
