


Redistricting Rules: Pennsylvania



At least 5 months:

Public hearings to take communities of interest testimony

Approx. 3 months: Process census data, display draft maps, hold hearings, complete maps

Approx. 2 months: Court & County Prep





Who draws the lines?

- Congressional lines are drawn by the state legislature as a statute subject to gubernatorial veto
- State legislative lines are drawn by a five-member commission (each of the majority and minority leaders from each chamber selects one commissioner, those four select a fifth) (Pa. Const. art. II, § 17(b))



Redistricting Rules: Pennsylvania Rules

What are the mapping rules?

- Federal equal population requirements and adherence to the Voting Rights Act and constitutional rules on race
- ▶ Districts should be **as nearly equal in pop.** as practicable (Pa. Const. Art. II, § 16)
- State legislative districts must be contiguous and compact, respecting existing jurisdictional boundaries unless "absolutely necessary" (Pa. Const. Art. II, § 16)
- Cannot dilute ability to elect candidates of choice on basis of partisanship for both congressional and state districts (League of Women Voters of Pa. v. PA)
