


Redistricting Rules: Texas Timeline



legislative session, a commission (Lt. Gov, House Speaker, Attorney Gen, Comptroller of Public Accounts, Commr of General Land Office) must enact redistricting plan within 150 days of the conclusion of session. Id. art. III, § 28.



Who draws the lines?

- Congressional lines are drawn by the state legislature as a statute and are subject to a gubernatorial veto
- State legislative lines are drawn by the state legislature, but if the state legislature fails to pass a plan, it goes to a 5-member backup commission (Tex. Const. art. III, § 28)






What are the mapping rules?

- Federal equal population requirements and adherence to the Voting Rights Act and constitutional rules on race
- State legislative districts must be as equal in population as possible (Tex. Const. Art. III, § 26)
- State legislative districts must be contiguous and preserve whole counties when possible (Tex. Const. Art. III, §§ 25-26)
